

**Resolution on Undergraduate Retakeable/Repeatable Courses**  
**Educational Policy and Student Affairs Committee**  
**June 7, 2010**  
**For Second Reading& Vote**

Preamble: Ohio University has allowed any undergraduate course to be retaken for the purpose of improving the student grade; the number of retakes allowed is controlled by the department or school at the time the course is submitted for approval. In addition, an undergraduate course identified as being repeatable for credit may be repeated for an unlimited number of hours or a finite number of hours. Furthermore these numbers vary from course to course across the University,

**Whereas** the new Student Information System (PeopleSoft) cannot deal with retakeable classes--when the number of allowable retakes varies across campus--without expensive modification; and

**Be It Resolved** that the number of times that a student may be allowed to retake an undergraduate class for the purpose of improving a grade be restricted to a maximum of two in addition to the first attempt, and undergraduate repeatable courses may be repeatable for an unlimited number of hours. Colleges, departments or schools will establish policies for additional retakes if and when appropriate. These changes are to become effective **with courses offered** Summer 2010-11.<sup>1</sup>
