Taryn Osborne has been incredibly active in the Ohio University community during her three years at Ohio University. A junior from Cincinnati studying <u>Political Science Pre-Law</u> she has picked up a <u>Spanish Minor</u> as well as the <u>Certificate in Law Justice & Culture</u>.

She is also very involved in co-curricular and extracurricular activities. Osborne has been an active member in Alpha Gamma Delta for three years and is a Barbara Caldwell Scholar. Additionally, she has been active in the Pre-Law Fraternity, Phi Alpha Delta, since her freshman year and is the secretary for the Ohio University Mock Trial Team, an organization she joined last year.
