She is clinical supervisor for brief therapy treatments at the East End Community Health Clinic in Toronto. Her research interests include the development of a narrative processes model and an assessment interview and coding system for psychotherapy discourse.

Angus is the senior editor of <u>The Handbook of Narrative and Psychotherapy: Practice, Theory, and Research</u> (2003) and coeditor of <u>Bringing Psychotherapy Research to Life: Understanding Change Through the Work of Leading Clinical Researchers</u> (2010).
