Conceived 17 years ago at Ohio State University as a gateway through which to promote the rich complexity of Latin America, the OLAC annually brings together a diverse group of specialists on the region.

In recent years, Bowling Green, Case Western, Ohio State and Wittenberg University have kept alive the conference's mission of gathering varied scholarly work pertaining to that continent.
